Starting on September, 2026 school extracurricular activities on holidays(weekends) will be replaced by Regional Club activities.






Hamamatsu City aims to create a safe environment where all Jr.

Why are School Extracurricular Activities on holidays(weekends) changing to Regional Club activities



Until now, these activities were conducted and guided primarily by the school's teachers.

However, due to the impact of the low birth rate, the number of students is decreasing, making it difficult to build the teams, and the workload of teachers is increasing. Therefore, it is becoming difficult to continue the current format.

Hamamatsu City has decided to preserve the benefits of club activities while creating an environment where everyone can continue to take part in sports, cultural and artistic activities on weekends, without being limited to the framework of school activities. This is called "Regional Development of weekend extracurricular activities".

Hamakuru, is a local Club activity that Hamamatsu aims to promote. Hamakuru Certified Clubs, will be certified in accordance to Hamakuru's philosophy and will work with local residents to enjoy a variety of sports and activities, in addition to the traditional sports and cultural and artistic activities found in club activities.

Participation procedure

※If the student is already a member of a Club that becomes a Hamakuru Certified Club, there is no special procedure to continue joining.

1 Looking for a Club to join

Check out the portal site (under construction), and find a club you would like to join from the Hamakuru Certified Clubs. Check the club policy, details of the events, transportation to the activity location, participation fees, and discuss participation with your family.

2 Contact the Club

Once the Club to join is being decided, follow the portal site inquires and application (currently under construction). Visit and experience the activities first, could be a good start.

3 Join a Club and start the activities

After completing the application, carefully check the activity schedule, time, location, needed items to join the club. The activities can finally start!









Benefits of a "Hamakuru Certified Club"



A Certified Club is safe

"Hamakuru Certified Club", is an organization that meets all the certification requirements set by Hamamatsu City. Each Club, carries activities in accordance with the Hamakuru Guidelines, so participation is safe.



Select based on your own preference

Students can choose to join a cultural/arts activity according to their interest. Multiple Clubs are also acceptable.



Take on new activities and challenges

Students can easily try out sports and fields that are not offered at their own school. It is a chance to broaden horizons.



Establishing a community interaction

Depending on the activities, students may be able to join activities with local adults and friends of different ages, expanding network and contacts.

a Hamakuru Certified Club

Once certified by the city, the club can operate as a "Hamakuru Certified Club".



To become a "Hamakuru Certified Club", a club can be established from zero or transition from an existing club.

Five requirements must be clearly stated in the application for certification. Certified clubs will receive support from the city, such as free use of JR. High School facilities.
